Why Curbside Recycling?

- Curbside recycling is a desired service
 - Resident satisfaction surveys
- Farmers Branch is the only urban city in Dallas
 County that does not offer this service
- Recycled materials have an economic value
- Recycling conserves natural resources

Why Curbside Recycling?

- Curbside recycling benefits:
 - Recycling easier for all residents
 - Higher recycling rates
 - Conserves valuable landfill air space for unrecyclable materials
 - No long term liability with recycling, unlike landfills

Committee Recommendations

- Curbside recycling for single family homes
- Frequency: Every other week collection
- 95 gallon carts
- Assess a \$3 monthly fee
- Form an ongoing committee to assess other opportunities to implement sustainable practices
