

## Minor Home Repair Program Updates

CITY COUNCIL MEETING | July 16, 2024



## Program Objectives



Bring a single-family, owner-occupied residence into compliance with the City's residential property maintenance standards, and/or



Protect the health and safety of the residents and/or the neighborhood, and/or



Provide for accessibility modifications, and/or



Improve the livability of the property and/or the neighborhood, and/or



When an owner-occupant lacks sufficient financial resources of their own to repair the need.

### **Current and Proposed Program**

#### Current

- 12-month pilot program with a \$75,000 budget from general fund approved last year
- Cost-matching 50% grant from \$500-\$3,750, in which project total cost cannot exceed \$7,500
- Eligibility via HUD low-income limits (80% median family income or below)
   and homestead exemption
- Resident provides bank statements, paystubs, tax returns, copy of deed, etc.
- Following eligibility approval, city to then bid/quote, then repair completed
- Secured via first or second lien for up to seven years, to ensure property remains principal residence for owner-occupant for three-seven years
- One project funded via community partner assistance, but many interested parties but either didn't qualify or couldn't meet cost-matching requirement

#### **Proposed**

- Grant up to \$5,000 with no project total cost cap, removing cost-matching restriction
- Eligibility via market home value and homestead exemption as verified by DCAD data
  - For 2023, the average market value is \$395,455
- Three quotes reviewed by City contractor for applicability and selection
- City to pay up to \$5,000 to selected quote, with resident responsible for any additional costs
- City contractor to regularly visit during project for oversight and final inspection
- Resident to agree to remain owner-occupant for three years via application



## Proposed Program Phases

#### Application Review

City staff review for eligibility and ensure repair meets program guidelines.

## Project Approval & Commencement of Work

Homeowner notified of project approval/denial by
City staff. Selected quote/contractor notified, if
approved, to begin permitting and work.

Homeowner Inquiry

#### Application

Homeowner submits application, documentation, and description/photos of damage or repair needed.

#### Initial Inspection

Contractor review and inspection onsite to verify project needs and review three quotes for applicability. Project Closeout

#### Project Oversight

Review contractor to regularly visit to evaluate progress and update staff.

Completes final inspection to verify project completion, along with photo documentation.
