- Short-term crisis/stabilization counseling for survivors of intimate partner violence, domestic violence, familial sexual abuse, etc.

SMALL GROUPS 186 STUDENTS PARTICIPATED IN SUPPORT GROUPS AND LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT ACROSS DALLAS, GRAND PRAIRIE, AND CARROLLTON-**FARMERS** BRANCH ISDS.

IN THE CLASSROOM 5,238 students received Be Project violence prevention education through their Health classes, social-emotional learning periods, or summer camps.

PARENTS&TEACHERS

1,773 parents, school staff, and other youthserving professionals received Be Project training related to teen dating violence and youth development.

SCHOLARSHIP

EMILY DERRICK OF NEWMAN SMITH HIGH SCHOOL AND DANIELA QUIROGA OF IRMA RANGEL YOUNG WOMEN'S LEADERSHIP ACADEMY WERE EACH AWARDED A \$1500 BE PROJECT SCHOLARSHIP FOR THEIR EFFORTS IN BE PROJECT PROGRAMMING AS WELL AS THEIR COMMITMENT TO PROMOTING HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS AS THEY TRANSITION TO COLLEGE.

Before Be Project:

64% of students were able to identify abusive behaviors 80% of students could describe ways to help a friend in an abusive relationship

AFTER BE PROJECT

93% OF STUDENTS WERE ABLE TO IDENTIFY ABUSIVE BEHAVIORS 96% OF STUDENTS COULD DESCRIBE WAYS TO HEIP A FRIEND IN AN **ABUSIVE** RELATIONSHIP



Budget
