Public Hearing

CITY OF FARMERS BRANCH NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER ORDINANCE NO. 3955

AN ORDINANCE RESCINDING ORDINANCE NO. 3886 AND ADOPTING ORDINANCE NO. 3955 COVERING STANDARDS OF CARE FOR THE CITY OF FARMERS BRANCH YOUTH PROGRAMS.

The City Council will hold a public hearing to consider Ordinance No. 3995 on Tuesday, November 4, 2025. The hearing will take place in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, located at 13000 William Dodson Parkway, City Hall Plaza, Farmers Branch, Texas.

Beginning in 1994 State law requires youth programs to be licensed as daycare programs.

In 1995 Senate Bill 212 was enacted, exempting municipal youth programs from childcare licensing requirements.

With the enactment of SB212 the City annually adopts the Standards of Care by ordinance following a public hearing.

Notice of Public Hearing was published to the Dallas Morning News on September 22 and October 13 of this year.
