Subject: Transform Squire Park Public Outreach Program Update

The public outreach program for Transform Squire Park began on April 15th with the launch of an online survey and advertisements for an in-person meeting. The initial meeting, scheduled for April 30th at Squire Park, was canceled due to weather conditions.


To ensure continued engagement, staff held an online meeting on May 7th. Input was gathered from citizens via email. A suggestions that emerged from this online feedback was a potential interest in a dog park. Citizens emphasized the park's importance as a legacy and a place for memories, highlighting its role as a "third place" in the community.


The next public outreach meeting took place on June 5th. At this event, Squire Park users rotated through tables, dedicating 15 minutes at each to discuss park amenities and offer their thoughts and suggestions for the park's transformation. Key takeaways from this meeting included:

- Enhanced landscaping
- Consideration for incorporating a dog park
- Upgrading of existing park amenities


The online survey has been open for 68 days and has received 119 entries as of June 10th. The survey includes background questions to help us understand our respondents better.
