REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS

C.1 Discuss and provide direction to staff regarding adding a polling location on the west side of the City for the June 13, 2026, Runoff Election.

Interim City Secretary/Director of Administrative Services Stacy Henderson gave a presentation on the following:

- Background of the existing polling location managed by the City.
- Review of the two proposed polling locations on the west side of the City.
- The cost to add a second polling location in the City.

Council provided the following recommendations:

- In favor of the Keenan Service Center as a second polling location in the City. (Councilmember Gonzalez)
- Recommended Brookhaven College, Manske Library, Envision, or the Fire Administration building as optional polling locations in the City. (Councilmember Villafranca)
- Not in favor of adding a second polling location for the Runoff Election. (Councilmember Neal)
- Not in favor of adding a second polling location for the Runoff Election. (Mayor Lynne)
- Requested to no longer have schools as polling locations in the City during future elections. (Mayor Lynne)
- In favor of adding the Fire Administration building as a polling location for future elections. (Mayor

Lynne)

The majority of the Council was in favor of not adding a second polling location on the west side of the City for the June 13, 2026, Runoff Election and discussing adding a second polling location at a future Council meeting.

C.2 Consider approving Ordinance No. 4002 canvassing the results of the May 2, 2026, general election, declaring the successful candidate for District 2, ordering a runoff election for the seat of the Mayor to be held on June 13, 2026, and establishing the date, time, and polling places for the runoff election; and take appropriate action.

A motion was made by Deputy Mayor Pro Tem Neal, seconded by Councilmember Villafranca, to approve Ordinance No. 4002 as presented. The motion carried with the following vote:
