Texas Schools are using AI to screen books in their collection to see if they need to be removed under the new law. Some of the problems encountered are misidentification of the trigger words that are not intended to be offensive like, "gay", "queer" or just the word "sex". ## A Library on the border of Quebec and Vermont closed due to new US immigration policies

A small library intentionally designed to be on the shared border between Canada and the US has been closed due to fears of violations of immigration policies. Access to the library has existed for over a century, and the building is considered a historical landmark. Access to Canadians was terminated on October 1, 2025. The Haskell Public Library and Opera House issued library cards to anyone living within a 30-mile radius of the library. A black line marked the border through the middle of the building.
