Christmas Tree Lighting - the official lighting of the Farmers Branch Christmas Tree will be held on Saturday, December 6, beginning at 7:00 pm at the Historical Park; events will include a fireworks show, visit from Santa, refreshments, tours of the historical structures, tubing on snow hill and more; admission is free; parking at Metrosquare Business Park, two blocks south of the Historical Park on Ford Road with a free shuttle to the gate
