



Celebrating the Parks and Recreation Month

Members of PARD participated in 16 various pop-up events, including a tour of the John F. Burke Nature Preserve with residents and a variety of recreational activities throughout the month of July.

Net Promoter Score-Aquatics and Recreation Center

The Aquatics and Recreation Center has achieved a Net Promoter Score (NPS) of 81, placing it in the 'Exceptional' category
