# FLEET REPLACEMENT GUIDELINES



## INTRODUCTION

Provide a clear and consistent approach to the replacement of city-owned assets, thereby promoting operational efficiency across all departments



## SAFETY & ENVIRONMENTAL

Ensuring the well-being of public and staff through reliable and modern equipment. Newer vehicles generally offer improved fuel efficiency and produce fewer emissions.



## COST AND BUDGETING

Preventing escalating maintenance costs and maximize resale value. Enables accurate long-term financial planning through a clear replacement schedule.



## EFFICIENCY AND MORALE

Ensure that departments have reliable equipment for seamless service delivery. Enhancing job satisfaction and productivity by providing modern and safe equipment.
