

Planning & Zoning Commission 2018 Work Plan

At its meeting on February 26, 2018, the Planning and Zoning Commission discussed their upcoming work plan for 2018 and provided direction related to categorizing the items for future discussion.

In order to assist staff with prioritizing the Commission's work plan for the upcoming year, staff obtained direction from the Commission at its meeting on March 12, 2018 related to prioritizing the items, particularly the Items Requiring In-depth Analysis so that staff may be responsive to the Commission's preferences. These items will be incorporated with the Commission's regular business items related to the development and use of property within the city (such as zoning cases, site plans and plats) and any other special studies that may affect the Commission's work plan. Also, additional items may be added to this work plan throughout the year.
