WHAT WE'VE BEEN UP TO



Worked to establish a clear committee purpose; planning for the future and exploring financing options



INVENTORY

Began documenting an inventory of existing art in Farmers Branch



IDENTIFYING

Collated existing events in the Metroplex to find opportunities to expand art & culture through events in Farmers Branch



COLLABORATING

Have met with other committees to discuss opportunities devoted to art & culture in Farmers Branch



DEVELOPING

Developed a branded concept for art on the west-side water tower, which can be carried over into other parts of the city



TOURING

Have toured locations that could be dedicated to art: Brookhaven College, Carrollton-Farmers Branch Fine Arts Department, The Brickyard, Manske Library, The Branch Connection, Historical Park, The Firehouse Theatre

RECOMMENDATIONS - EVENTS

- Biscuit Festival with a cooking competition and celebrity judges
- Showcase and tasting of Farmers Branch-based restaurants, catering companies and beverage distributors
- Farmers Branch Flip Fest a flea market type event where vendors bring items they've up-cycled and "flipped" to make into something new (Similar to concept behind the HGTV show "Flea Market Flip")
- Steampunk Festival (Farmers Branch was founded during the Victorian Era which Steampunk celebrates)
- Shakespeare in the Grove
- Musical review featuring local musical artists
- Performance Work Presentations
- Art walks through parks
- Mayor's Art Challenge
- "Yarn Bombs" in support of events



RECOMMENDATIONS — PUBLIC SPACE INSTALLATIONS



- Canopies over public walkways such as Pike Street
- Potential new Manske Library including the outdoor patio space and video wall
- Bridge and overpass support structures
- West-facing wall of The Firehouse Theatre
- In-street installations (colored bricks, paint, other materials) at key street crossings
- Large sculptural pieces in heavy foot traffic areas to encourage social media posts
- Decorative sculpture and landscape along railroad tracks on Inwood
- Public sculptures that support the local flora and fauna
- Host "overflow" art from Nasher Sculpture Center at City Hall or Manske Library

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

PARK IN LIEU OF FEE TO SUPPORT TRAILS/ART

% of development cost Waived if art is included in project

PRIVATE DONATIONS

Naming rights; Life estate gifts; Legacy plans

CORPORATE DONATIONS

Establish partnerships with local corporations to fund public art

FEDERAL & PRIVATE GRANTS

Research and apply for applicable grants

TAX

Use a percentage of the HOT tax to fund public art projects Add a Public Art & Culture tax on event ticket sales

THUN

PROCEEDS FROM SALE OF CITY LAND

Use a percentage of the proceeds from the sale of City land to fund public art projects

Establish a 501(c)(3) administrator for public art so that donated monies could be used tax-free and would represent taxable deductions for donors
