The table below offers a list of common violations and their priority ranking for abatement as established by the Code Enforcement Division. Please be advised that the priorities of the Code Enforcement Division are subject to change at any time based on a variety of factors.

For example:

- A broken air conditioner is a high-priority concern during the summer months but a low-priority concern during winter months.
- A missing fence panel is a high-priority concern at a vacant and unsecure property but a very-high priority at a vacant property with a pool.
